Our Stories

Will and Fannie Dodson enjoy a vantage point on the wall of Lillian Hammond's bedroom. They stare grim-faced in that black and white photograph. Born slaves, Will died in 1945, but Fannie, of African American and Choctaw descent, lived to be 98 before dying in 1962 when Lillian was 21. If they could talk, what would they say? I suspect they might be very proud of their great granddaughter.

Lillian was born at John Gaston Hospital in Memphis to Gilbert and Ruby Nelle Fisher. She lived in Lemoyne Garden, attending St. Augustine Catholic School, until 1951 when her Southern Baptist family moved to South Memphis. There, she went to Hamilton graduating in 1959.

Summers in high school, she worked at her father's neighborhood store, but after graduation, she told her father she wanted a real job and became the salad girl at the University Club.



"I was just 17 years-old and that was my first experience around white folks." It was a good experience for her. She made friends quickly, and people loved the young, new salad girl at the U Club.

That Fall, Maxine Smith, civil rights leader and friend of her parents, asked Lillian to enroll at then segregated Memphis State University. The NAACP was looking for a test case to force the University to admit blacks.

Lillian wasn't interested. "I didn't want to be a guinea pig," she said. That Fall, the "Memphis State Eight" successfully desegregated the University. It could have been the Memphis State Nine with Lillian. It's just as well there were only eight for the sake of that memorable rhyme, if for nothing else.

Lillian wanted to attend Fiske University, but her mother, hearing her son's tales of revelry at Tennessee State, thought Nashville was not for Lillian. So, she enrolled at Lincoln University in more sedate Jefferson City, Missouri, majoring in psychology and sociology and graduating in 1963.

She decided to teach, but that required student teaching in Jefferson City. Lillian was the first black student teacher in an all-white Jefferson City school, something her conservative principal did not appreciate.



He was a gruff, intimidating man who made her stand for his 40-minute interview with her, but the faculty welcomed her. They gave her a party at the end of the term. Her supervising teacher said she was a blessing, and the children loved her. Later, other aspiring, black students followed the trail blazed by Lillian in Jefferson City.

In Memphis, Lillian taught history at Manassas Junior High. She planned on a Master's Degree at Wayne State, but when her grandmother developed cancer she attended Memphis State at night, teaching during the day.

She met Allen Hammond at the Manassas-Melrose football game. She had a date with someone else but caught Allen's eye. When he called, she didn't want to talk to him, but her mother said, "Lillian,

you need to talk to this man. He's got the nicest voice I've ever heard." She accepted the call, and they began dating. The Reverend Jim Lawson married them in 1965, and the couple adopted Al, Jr. in 1970.

Later, she taught at Cory Junior High and was about to transfer to White Station when she got a call from Memphis State in 1968, a tumultuous year in Memphis. Huge protests demanded more black staff at Memphis State. The University searched for black talent. Lillian's graduate school professor recommended her, and Memphis State hired her as one of the first black counselors at University College.

"It was funny," she said. "I didn't want to be a guinea pig integrating Memphis State as a student, and here I was a guinea pig, after all, integrating the staff 10 years later."

She began to wheedle and cajole the administration to improve conditions for blacks. She complained that she was assigned black students only and that the registration process was segregated. Those policies quickly changed.

Dr. Jess Parrish coaxed her to join his staff at newly formed Shelby State. She finally agreed and rose to the position of Dean of Institutional Advancement which oversaw public relations, research and development, as well as serving as liaison to the public school system. With five directors underneath her, she helped start Middle College High School, a joint venture between Shelby State and the Memphis City Schools, which identified intelligent but disadvantaged children, in danger of dropping out. Lillian facilitated their enrollment in Middle College enabling them to enter college at a sophomore level.

Her husband's illness forced her retirement in 1991. Allen died in 1997 of lung cancer. She began doing consulting work at Memphis State, again, and then later at the Hyde Foundation which, with Lillian's assistance, helped fund the first charter school in Memphis, KIP (Knowledge is Power) Charter School.

"And that's when I met George Brown!" She declared. George was Circuit Court judge, and a good friend of her husband. In fact, he had been one of the pall-bearers at Allen's funeral. He offered his legal help. They began dating and married in 2002.

After that, Lillian's fortunes waned. She fell while showering requiring extensive surgeries. A year later, she had a stroke. With good physical therapy, her health returned, but illness took a toll on her marriage. She and George divorced in 2020.

"I was already good friends with Ann Knox and Dina Smith so, Trezevant seemed like a natural fit," she explained. She came in 2020 and immediately made her presence known. She's joined the Scholarship Committee, the Acts of Kindness Committee, the Black History Committee, and produced a fashion show that raised over \$30,000 for Hope's Garden, all within a year of her arrival, just prior to her eightieth birthday.

I wonder. What must they think
-- Will and Fanny Dodson -watching all this unfold from the
bedroom wall? Unlike them, she
was born free, but, like them, she
faced obstacles. How delighted they
must be at her success!

I would imagine they are very proud, indeed, of their great granddaughter.

Forward With Hope




